Summer clean up notes!

*All property buildings and yards are to be maintained in a reasonable tidy manner and grass must be mowed by June 1.

*Assist our village street dept by keeping your section of the street clear of debris for water to have access to street drains.

*ORD. 2019-19—do not blow leaves or grass clippings into street.

*If your property has a public sidewalk, it is **your** responsibility to maintain it for safe access for all. Broken sidewalks need to be repaired by the property owner.

*The Butler County Health Department provides "dunkits" for preventing mosquitoes in standing water.

What's been going on in the village? It is hard to include everything that our hardworking village personnel do in a couple of sentences...but here are some recent highlights:

Our Streets and Grounds department has been very busy patching pot holes, clearing drainage ditches and picking up trash throughout the village. The police department's leaky roof has been repaired. Both bathrooms in the fire house have new floors, toilets and grab bars to help bring them up to code. Our village engineer, Mr. Terry Dalrymple has been attending multiple meetings and making hundreds of phone calls to help find solutions to the complex flooding issues throughout the village. Our Fire and Life Squad departments have been very busy updating medical equipment and training volunteers to help keep us safe. Please make sure your house address is **visible** from the street to better help them respond quickly in an emergency. Don't forget the annual Fish Fry on June 11. Entertainment will be Justin Back and Jimmy Rogers. Price is \$15 for adults and \$8 for children. If you don't fancy fish—there will be hot dogs available, too.

Like with many things recently, our water rate will increase in June to reflect the additional charges from our water supplier. When making payments, please include your payment stub and write your account number on your check.

Mayor Gorsuch wants to reiterate that communication is important with everyone in the village. If you have questions about maintenance, safety concerns or ordinances, please call her or attend one of the monthly council meetings.

Every five years, we ask our residents to approve a renewal tax levy for operating expenses. Without these funds, some of our Village departments would cease to exist. Please vote yes to renew our Village operations levy on November 8, 2022.
